Last months minutes read and approved.

Treasurer Report - No Report

Board of Elders

We discussed the status of Emmaus shut-ins and those with health problems. If you learn of any Emmaus member that has come down with a serious health problem and has been admitted to a hospital, <u>PLEASE</u> contact Pastor Smith or the church secretary --so they are not the last to know. The Elders discussed CH 12 of The Fire and the Staff: about five fundamental principles of making changes in the church (acknowledged in Luther's Wittenberg sermons):

1 Change must be required by the Gospel

2 The Word, not force, should effect change

3 If it isn't broken, don't fix it

4 When it comes to the Gospel, don't let yourself get pushed around---stand firm

5 Always yield to the weak

The following board members were present at our meeting on Tuesday, March 1: Katie Arritt, Karla Frownfelter, Roger Foster, Betty Foster, Robert Carey, Kenny Colton, and JoAnn Riemer. Brenda Salinas is unable to attend currently due to her health issues. We began our meeting with a prayer for Brenda and also a prayer for the success of this meeting according to the will of God. In a <u>Pantry Update</u> we have obtained the new phone number of the pantry. This will be included in the "News From the Pew" that goes home with the school families. The new number is 317-474-0149.

Our next order of business was to plan the <u>March 16 Lenten Dinner</u>. It was decided to have spaghetti with meat sauce (made by Katie & Karla), salad, garlic bread (supplied by Roger), drinks,

dump cake (made by JoAnn), and cookies (supplied by Roger).

We then Planned Everybody's Birthday Party which takes place Saturday, March 19 from 5-7 p.m. Katie Arritt has agreed to head this up along with JoAnn. We were informed that the school is hosting a lock-in that same night, so we will probably have a larger school population on hand. The plan is to serve pizzas purchased by the board members from Aldi's (about 10) along with soft drinks. Perhaps the school will be supplementing this with some extra food. Then we will be playing a game or two like you do at a birthday party. All participants get to pick out a present from the box. These are very inexpensive things purchased at the Dollar Store. Of course, we also have birthday cake, ice cream, and punch and sing "Happy Birthday" to everyone. All this is publicized by flyers in our church/school and at the Pantry and on Facebook.

<u>Treat Days</u> for the school children will take place on two more Wednesdays this year. The first is Wednesday, April 6. We will also have treats on either May 11 or May 18. I have to see what works

best with the school schedule in May.

We spent quite a bit of time in discussing the <u>Easter Egg Hunt.</u> This will take place on Saturday, April 9 at 11 a.m. Because this is a large event, we will have co-leaders for this event. Betty Foster & JoAnn Riemer will work together to lead this event. On March 3, JoAnn applied for \$250 Thrivent Money to help finance the hunt. The menu for the hunt is a continental breakfast of fresh fruit, fruit juice, cinnamon rolls, milk, and coffee. We will begin asking for donations of wrapped Easter candy suitable for stuffing in the plastic eggs on March 20. At that time we will also begin asking for volunteers to work at the hunt. There will be an "Egg Stuffing Day" on Wednesday, April 6. On this day, the volunteers will be fed lunch courtesy of Thrivent. Betty & JoAnn will be looking through the available crafts so that ordering can take place as soon as the money arrives from Thrivent. We have a lot of plastic eggs available that were donated in previous years, so the supply should be adequate. The publicity will be handled in the usual way.

We talked briefly about whether or not to hold a <u>May Activity</u>. In 2021 we had a cookout in the park with \$250 Thrivent Money with about 50 in attendance. This took place about mid-month. It was decided to table this idea for the present time and discuss it further at the next meeting.

Parish Planning Council Minutes APRIL, 2022

Pastor opened with prayer Last months minutes were approved.

Treasurer Report -

The Second voucher payment has been received and placed into the account, 130,000 + is in the book and the third payment will come in May. From a cash standpoint the Church and School are good and as expected. Thee will be a need to pull some SGO money for the remaining students not receiving voucher money, Mike and Derek to discuss and resolve in the next few days.

Soon after Easter Derek will call the members of the budget committee together to discuss the future. This group will include and Elder, a School Board member, the Facilities manager, Executive Director and the Paster - who at this point is also the acting principal.

Board of Elders

Elders went through the list of at home or at facilities members, those unable to attend church. Also discussed Pastor and one of the elders attending the church convention in Fort Wayne. There was a brief update on the video and sound in which a professional audio visual expert was going to come in and get the system up and running. The elders have begun studying the book *Hammer of God.*

School Board/Principal

Mike Lee went over the last few weeks and the situation with the change on principal/teachers. Brandon had stated he did not want to be both a teacher and a principal so the school board had deemed needing a teacher was a priority and therefore Brandon is no longer the principal. The Paster will take over those duties he is required to perform. In addition to alleviate some of the responsibilities, one of the teachers has been named Dean of Students and another teacher has been named athletic director. Funds going toward the principal salary will be divided among those two new positions as well as the school secretary and they take on many of the principal day to day functions and the Paster will be acting principal delegating much of the day to day activities in a supervisory role.

A Title 1 person will be more involved next year with assisting in the reading and helping students get up to required levels for testing results. This will also coincide with a new Language Arts Curriculum. Emmaus school is still in the progress of seeking another teaching candidate and working to solidify student numbers for next year which now looks to be slightly above the beginning of the past/current school year.

Carol and Laura Smallwood (a member of the school board and overseeing accreditation), will be finalizing and turning in the paperwork application the district office. The will proceed the on site visit from the district office near the end of April.

Outreach Board

Easter Egg hunt was a success with a really good number of children and parents present, a full report can be found in the April 2022 PPC folder. There is a MAY field day coming up along with some other events. This led to a discussion of how many events are expected from the board and whether one per month is still a realistic expectation. This led to a listing of what events did actually happen every month which revealed that there are actually a few months in question and that some outreach events happen outside the Board, Thanksgiving and last year Christmas being two of them. The will be revisited next month.

Fellowship Board

Fellowship leader was not present due to spending time with the Accreditation.

Properties Board

USA Comfort Air was out several times to fix issues with the boiler this month. Some of the parts previously installed by them were put in upside-down. There were also issues will old pipes that had rusted through.

The 3 radiators in the sanctuary that we were going to replace have not been ordered yet. There is a new rep at USA Comfort Air that has concerns about the new units that would replace them. These would be modern units that are not the same size. Since Emmaus is a historical building, he thought this may be a problem.

No new information on the two signs, one in the park facing Orange Street and one in front of the church near the corner also facing Orange Street.

The fire doors leading into the gym need be replaced. They have been paid for and ordered. The doors should be delivered by the end of April.

The last of the new smartboards will be installed on Wednesday, April 13th.

The window contractor has ordered the windows for the Pre-K room and unfinished classroom. Delivery and installment is expected in June.

Some the inside doors will need to be re-keyed.

Previously reported, still outstanding due to monetary constraints:

- -There are still repairs needed to the gym roof that causes minimal damage and will be postponed until money is available. Not currently part of the 5-year plan.
- -The roofers found a problem with the brick in the bell tower. Repairs will be postponed until funds are available. Not currently part of the 5-year plan.
- Repairs are needed to the main entrance to the church. The brick mortar needs to be replaced because of efflorescence. We will have to hire someone to do this. Not currently part of the 5-year plan.




